CONTACT LENS AND REFRACTION SERVICES AND FEES:

Refraction: \$60.00 (APPLIES TO ALL PATIENTS)

A refraction consists of checking the visual acuity and determining the optical correction required for the best visual functioning. This also includes a prescription for glasses. A glasses prescription is not considered to be part of a comprehensive eye exam and therefore has a separate fee associated with it. If you have separate vision insurance, refraction is a covered benefit. Medical insurance (including Medicaid) typically does not cover your refraction so you will be responsible for the cost.

Contact Lens Fitting and Evaluation (APPLIES TO CONTACT LENS WEARERS)

The fitting and evaluation of contact lenses is considered a supplemental exam and is not included. Medical insurance does not cover the cost of fitting/evaluating contacts. If you have vision insurance, plans vary and may not cover that cost. Contact lens prescriptions are valid for one year only so even if you like your current contacts they must be re-evaluated and prescribed every year.

Current Contact Lens Wearers:

The contact lens fitting fee includes evaluating the vision in current lenses to see if changes need to be made, checking to ensure contacts fit appropriately and are not causing any ocular health problems. Fee also includes trial lens if needed and follow up within 90 days of initial appointment. If you come in after 90-days you will be charged an additional fee. Some specialty lenses come with a 90-day warranty for exchanges/returns, and we will notify at the time of fitting if your lens falls into that category.

In addition to contact lens/evaluation fee described above, it is necessary to be instructed by an eye care professional on the proper insertion and removal. A prescription will not be released without having the proper training. Your training includes how to insert and remove contacts, how to properly care for them and a starter kit that includes solution and a storage case.
